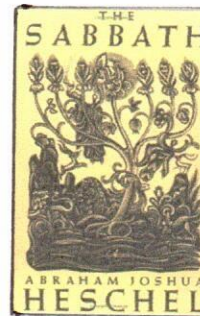

We will share objects and stories our ancestors have left us. Come light candles, enjoy family stories, and share some food and song.

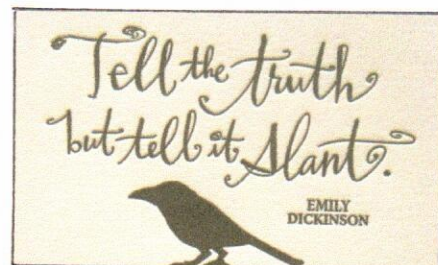

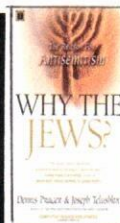
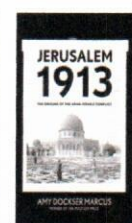
Film: *It Is No Dream*.
